I. Opening Reflection

Daily Lectionary reading for Dec 14, 2021 Isaiah 11:1-9 The Peaceful Kingdom

- 11 A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
- 2 The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
- 3 His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear;

- 4 but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;
- he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

Communications Coordinator

Jessica Weaver Boose has agreed to act as an interim communications coordinator through the beginning of February. This will get us through the intensive period of December and the congregational meeting. During this time, we will continue to recruit a permanent hire and Jessica will discern if she wishes to remain beyond February.

Jessica has worked in two congregational churches in Massachusetts as a Youth Leader and has experience with communications and social media. She grew up in Woodstock and moved back a little over a year ago.

Music Director

Maria Sangiolo-Jessurun has accepted an offer to be our part-time music director! Maria is familiar with FCCW and known by many in the community as an educator and an accomplished performer. She works at Rectory School as a learning specialist and has coordinated the music program for the Vanilla Bean Café for 14 years. She has recorded several children's CDs and toured nationally earlier in her career.

Maria is gifted and feels called to have music in her life in a meaningful way. She sees music as a way of ministering to people in the congregation and community. The search team unanimously agreed to offer Maria the position. She will begin after Christmas.

We have agreed to journey together over the next six months with openness and an eye to creating vibrant, joyful, intergenerational worship services as well as a meaningful music program that feeds the spirits of people in our greater community as well.

By way of clarification, Maria is stepping into the role as Music Director. She will help us create more participatory intergenerational worship. She is not tasked with faith formation or family ministry. In the budget conversation, you will see that we are planning to address these needs separately.
