# OUR PRAYERS FOR OUR SHARED MINISTRY TO HEAL THE WORLD



## A brief (re)introduction to our Pastor

Rev. Dr. Kevin Downer grew up in Pomfret, graduated from Putnam High, went to college in Worcester, and earned an MBA from UCONN. He was baptized and confirmed in the UCC, volunteered as a young adult at Silver Lake Conference Center, and was a member of several UCCs in CT.

A second career pastor, he spent more than ten years as a consultant, helping businesses use emerging technologies to streamline processes and enhance customer, employee, and stake holder relationships.

Ordained in 2006 by the Metropolitan Community Churches, he returned to his spiritual roots in the UCC receiving full standing through Privilege of Call in 2018. He holds a Master's in Divinity from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary and a Doctorate in Ministry from Chicago Theological Seminary.

He planted a diverse, emerging church in Chicago and served congregations in Minneapolis, Los Angeles, San Antonio, Toronto, and Worcester. His doctoral thesis is "Transforming Community: Dialogue and inquiry as a just and loving way of leading beyond fear, loss, and uncertainty."

Throughout his ministry he has worked with interfaith, ecumenical, and social justice organizations, including the LGBT Asylum Task Force in Worcester. He has received awards for his innovative ministry, and was recognized by the U.S. House of Representatives for transformational ministry with Founders MCC in Los Angeles – the first congregation to have a primary focus affirming the lives of LGBTQ people. He has appeared in several documentaries and an episode of Vanderpump Rules.

He is joined on this journey by his spouse, Toby Bishop. In August they celebrated 22 years together and the 16th anniversary of their marriage.

The stole Rev Kev is wearing was presented to him by the people of the Metropolitan Community Church of San Antonio following his ordination. Rev Kev began serving MCC San Antonio while in seminary and eight months before he was ordained.

While placing the stole on Rev Kev's shoulders, the Regional Elder pointed to the threads at the ends of each side of the stole and said, "Some might think of these as decoration, or that the artisan did not complete their work. As you wear this stole and serve Christ's church, may they always remind you that we live in an unfinished world, and have an unfinished calling."
