II. Ministry Update

A. Faith Formation

1. Weekly Prayer Meetings

2. Houses of Hope

Briefly, the team is organizing around various days and times to facilitate/co-lead the Houses of Hope Gratitude Pathway to the congregations. We have organized the content into a four and six session option. The plan is to offer groups that will meet weekly, bi-weekly, bi-monthly, or once a month. There will be three or four options for the congregation to choose from.

September 19 through 21, the director of Houses of Hope, Phil Dieke, and a documentarian, Autie Carlisle, will be in town and we, our congregation, will be the center of the Houses of Hope. I cannot not say this strongly enough, and it may be surprising to you, however we are the dream congregation for the Houses of Hope team. We've heard this from our coaches, and in a preparation conversation that Phil, Autie and I participated in Phile repeatedly shared how our team has embraced the program in ways they had only hoped a congregation might. The ways we have taken the content and embedded it into worship to expose the congregation to the practices, theologies, and process.
